Chapter 1

So what will this book do for me?

This book challenges many assumptions, especially relating to American politics, the media, American business, and a number of other self-focused entities, even organized religion. I have learned through my 50 years that organized religion is as man made as politics. However, I have seen too many "miracles" to not believe that there is one thing that is constant—God/heaven.

Before you get nervous, this book is not a religious work. My purpose is not to God-bash you. At the same time I have seen a spiritual thread running through everything, "a purpose under heaven for everything" as a wise man once said.

When Pearl Harbor was attacked, Americans were not rich but doing the right thing was the norm. When 9-11 happened, America was wealthy, but doing what was right was now based on convenience, not moral values. The *Greatest Generation* had nothing but one thing when Pearl

Harbor was attacked. What the *Greatest Generation* had was faith--faith in themselves, faith in their country and faith in God.

The Reckless Generation had everything but one thing when 9-11 happened. Most of the Reckless Generation did not have that one thing—faith. The lack of that one thing made a difference. Even now, a few years after 9-11, we are still in a rage, confusion and disoriented. The terrorists on 9-11 caught us off guard. Our initial reaction—go into Afghanistan and catch Osama—was the right thing to do. Then our direction became blurred. Our eye fell on Iraq. Saddam Hussein had nothing to do with 9/11. The pretext that Iraq had weapons of destruction proved false. All we have succeeded in doing over the last five years is to rile up the insurgents, and we have no idea when we will catch them, if at all.

The majority of the *Greatest Generation* made it through major difficulties and were quite selfless, thinking of others and doing only good. They followed a clear moral compass. The war was fought for liberty, so that nations could determine their own government. Is this the true motive today?

It has been said that all generations go bad. The Reckless

Generation failed to appreciate the inherent nobility the Greatest

Generation offered them, so it went from bad to worse. The majority of baby boomers did not do as well as their parent's generation. It is time that both the Reckless and the Millennium Generations pick up the fallen standard and repair it and then when their generations are over, they will have a flaming torch of selflessness to pass to their children's future.

It has been suggested that the Millennium Generation is 50% wholesome, 50% wicked, due to the break up of the family. When divorce enters or passing passions leave a child with only one parent, that child's development is jeopardized. The chance of that child leading a decent life is compromised. I wonder what my father would have been like if he and his younger brother had not rescued by his aunt.
